Circulation

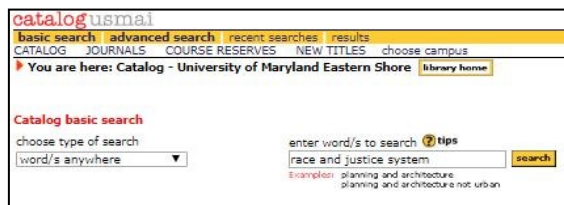

eBooks: The print collection is closed to patrons, but thousands of ebooks are available by searching the library catalog.

Access catalog for eBooks: <https://www.umes.edu/FDL/>

- Click "Find Books-Library Catalog" (first link on left)
- Enter the title, author or keywords and click "search"



In the results screen, an ebook has "Electronic Resources" in the format section. To access an ebook, click "find it" and then "Read full text." To read an ebook, you will need the 14-digit barcode from the back of your HAWKCard:

Reference questions should be directed to this email. You will receive a reply from a UMES librarian within 24 hours. The Reference Department will be staffed Monday-Friday from 8:00a.m. to 5:00p.m. There are no weekend hours.

Access online journals: In the library catalog, enter the journal title. Click "find it" next to the journal record and choose a full-text option.

Access databases for articles: <https://www.umes.edu/FDL/>
Click "Find Articles-Databases" for an alphabetical list or "Databases by Subject" for a list of databases by subject area. Choose the database best suited to your topic, and enter your keywords in either the basic or advanced search screens. You can limit your search results to full-text articles and scholarly journals.

Citing sources: After finding a database article relevant to your topic, click the "Cite" option to obtain citation information in various formats. Copy and paste the appropriate citation to your bibliography. **RefWorks** can also be used to cite sources and produce a bibliography. Create an account by clicking the link on the library homepage.
